2. Wild animals are those animals that live in the jungle. For example, a lion, a tiger, or an elephant.
3. Cows, cats, goats, and sheep are examples of harmless animals.
4. Dangerous animals include lions, tigers, leopards, and eagles.
5. Yes. Animals also require a well-balanced diet that includes all necessary nutrients, fluids, minerals, and vitamins. Proper nutrition provides animals with the energy they need to grow, develop, and reproduce. It also provides the immunity they need to fight infections.
6. Animals require shelter. Domestic animals reside in shelters made by humans. Pet animals also reside in shelters made by humans. Animals require shelter to protect themselves from the weather, other animals, and dust.
7. Sheep are the most important source of wool.

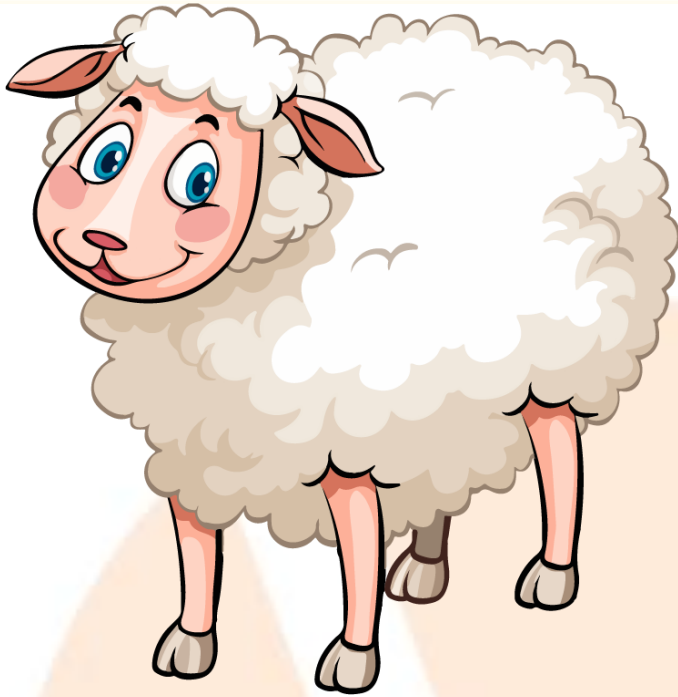


Image: Sheep

9. The chicken (a hen) provides both eggs and meat.

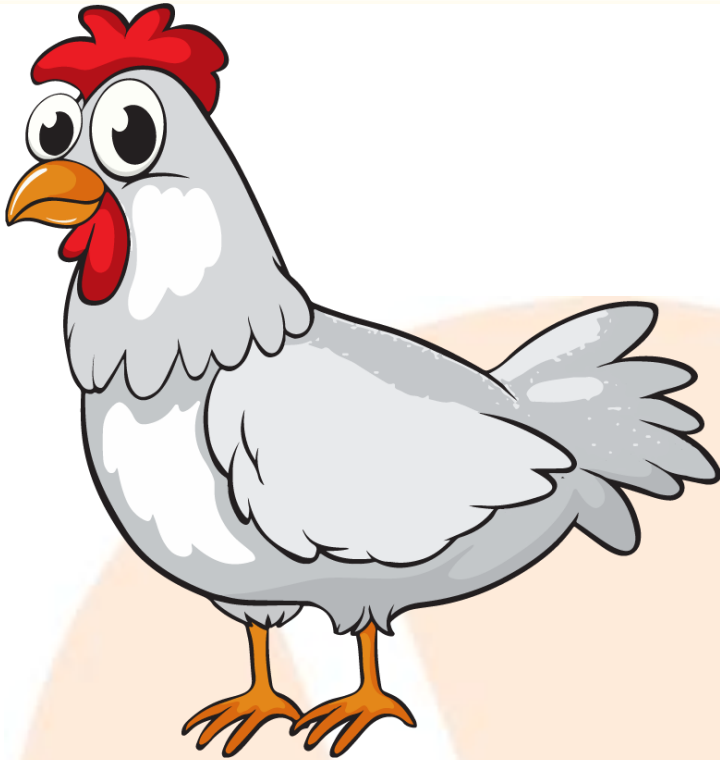


Image: Hen

14. Heavy loads are transported by animals such as horses and donkeys.

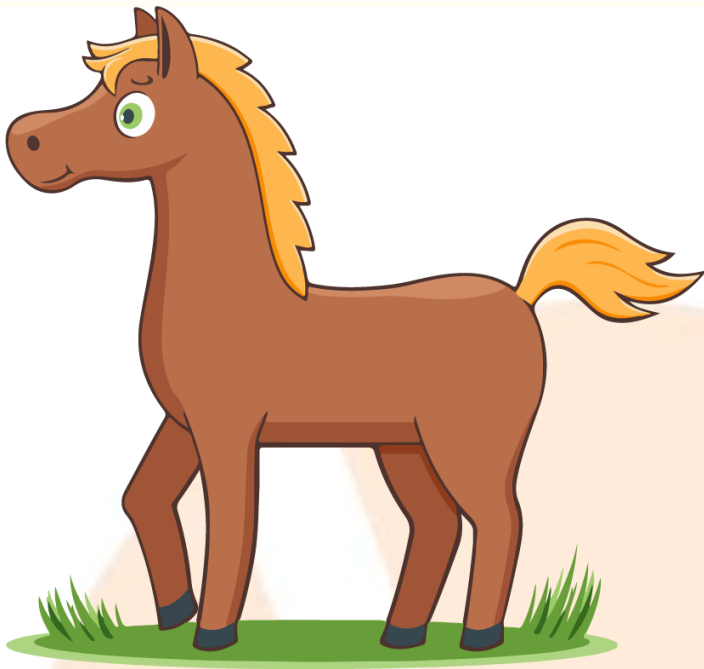


Image: Horse
